The Burt County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Tuesday, January 12, 2021 in the Boardroom of the Burt County Courthouse in Tekamah, Nebraska, pursuant to adjournment of their last meeting. Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by Publication in the Plaindealer (1-5-2021), upon a 1st floor bulletin board within the courthouse and on the County's Website. A copy of the proof of publication is on file in the office of the County Clerk. The following members were present: David Schold, Cliff Morrow, Gary "Bird" Swanson, Paul Richards, Carl Pearson, Dale Webster and Ted Connealy.

The meeting opened at 9:00 A.M. with the pledge of Allegiance. County Clerk Sarah Freidel informed the public that the Open Meeting Act is posted on the wall.

The first order of business was **reorganization**. County Clerk Freidel asked for nominations for Chairman of the Board. Morrow motioned to nominate David Schold, and Connealy seconded the motion. Swanson moved that the nominations cease, seconded by Webster, and Schold was elected Chairman of the Board for 2021. By roll call vote. Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays – none. Motion passed. David Schold will be Chairman for 2021.

The next order of business, also part of reorganization, was to appoint a Vice-Chairman. Chairman Schold asked for nominations for Vice-Chairman of the Board. Pearson moved to nominate Cliff Morrow, and Webster seconded the motion. Connealy moved that the nominations cease, and that Cliff Morrow be elected Vice-Chairman of the Board for 2021. The motion was seconded by Pearson. By roll call vote: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays – none. Motion passed. Cliff Morrow will be Vice-Chairman for 2021.

Upon motion by Webster, seconded by Connealy, the agenda was approved. By roll call vote: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays – none.

The minutes of the last meeting were approved upon motion by Swanson, seconded by Morrow. By roll call vote: Ayes – All. Nays – none.

The County Clerk Report of Fees, the County Court Report of fines, the District Court Fee Report and the Zoning Report for December; the Sheriff's Quarterly Report and Treasurer's 6 month report; the following Miscellaneous Receipts in the amount of \$1,529,305.78 and Fund Balances were all approved upon motion by Morrow, seconded by Connealy. By roll call vote: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays – none. Motion passed.



Board Members Connealy and Swanson moved for adoption of Resolution 2021-01 approving County Depositories for 2021 calendar year. By roll call vote: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays – none. Resolution was adopted.

By roll call vote: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays- none. Motion passed. The cost of living will be applied for all regular employees.

Board Members Webster and Morrow moved for adoption of Resolution 2021-02 approving an Interlocal Agreement with Region 4 Behavioral Health System. By roll call vote: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays – none. Resolution was adopted.

Upon motion by Connealy, seconded by Richards, the County Board approved the release of \$300.00 from the Visitors Promotion Fund (0990) for the grant. By roll call vote: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays-none. Motion passed. (2) **Burt County Economic Development Board members** were reviewed and motion was made by Morrow, seconded by Connealy, to appoint the following members, with roll call vote as follows: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays-none. 2021 Board Member appointments: re-appoint Gary Swanson and Jennifer Hinman for 1 year appoint Dave Schold for 1 yearTed Connealy had to come off after 5 years

Upon motion by Swanson, seconded by Morrow, the Board approved the appointment of Linda Elliott to serve a 3 year term on the Advisory Board of Northeast Nebraska Area Agency on Aging. By roll call vote: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays – none. Motion passed.

Upon motion by Richards, seconded by Connealy, the Board authorized Chairman January 12, 2021





Schold to sign the 2020 Burt County Weed Control Authority Activities and Information Report. By roll call vote: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays – none. Motion passed.

Connealy made a motion to go into *Closed Session*, Swanson seconded, and the motion passed with All Ayes. Chairman Schold declared at 10:18 A.M. the board went into closed session *for the protection of public interest to discuss job positions*. Connealy made a motion to come out of Closed Session, Webster seconded, and motion passed with All Ayes. Chairman Schold declared the public meeting back in regular session at 11:07 A.M. No action was taken during closed session.

ZONING:

Andrew Donawa, resigned as Burt County Zoning and Floodplain administrator. Richards made a motion that the Board accept Andrew's resignation and appoint the Roads Department office as Interim Burt County Zoning and Floodplain Administrator, motion was seconded by Connealy. By Roll Call Vote: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays – none. Motion passed. Ann Chytka and her office assistant will oversee Zoning needs. Zoning salary will be a flat rate of \$1,000.00 paid monthly.

Board Members Pearson and Webster moved for adoption of Resolution 2021-03 adopting updated Zoning Regulations. By roll call vote: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays – none. Resolution was adopted. **RESOLUTION #2021-03**

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission of Burt County, Nebraska recommended to the Burt County Board of Supervisors, the acceptance of new regulations and amendments to Burt County Zoning Regulations in the following sections: 2.02 (Definitions); 4.03 (A-1 Agricultural- Primary District); 4.12 (Airport Hazard Protection -District (Overlay)); 6.03 B (Commercial/Utility Grade Wind Energy Systems); and 6.15 (Solar Energy Conversion Systems).

AND WHEREAS, the Burt County Board of Supervisors held a public hearing on December 28, 2020 to consider the new regulations and amendments.

AND WHEREAS, the public was present to make comments for and against these new regulations and amendments. NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Burt County Board of Supervisors that the Burt County Zoning regulations and amendments in the following sections: 2.02 (Definitions); 4.03 (A-1 Agricultural- Primary District); 4.12 (Airport Hazard Protection -District (Overlay)); 6.03 B (Commercial/Utility Grade Wind Energy Systems); and 6.15 (Solar Energy Conversion Systems) are hereby adopted.

The Burt County Planning Commission (Zoning Board) recommended Zoning Regulation changes for the County Board to consider. They held a public hearing for both issues on January 11, 2021 and sent the following two (2) recommendations: (1) changes to manure regulations in Section 4.03 B. #23 & #24– take out #24 "The application of livestock manure in Burt County by operations located outside the county shall require a conditional use permit." AND make changes to #23 to remove two words "inside or"; "The spreading, stockpiling, or composting of dead livestock, sludge, by-products from manufacturing or any processing plant, and/or paunch manure on agricultural land by municipalities or operations inside or outside of the County." (2a.) *add language* for January 12, 2021





warning tape for buried utility line, cited at Section 6.03 (Wind) (Commercial) (Setbacks) and Section 6.15 (Solar) (installation design) – "Utility line buried 42" from ground grade *with warning tape installed 12" above utility line*". (2b.) in all Districts of Section 4, as permitted conditional use, add the following statement "Utility line buried 42" from ground grade with warning tape installed 12" above utility line." The County Board will have to hold a public hearing for these changes to be considered.

Upon motion by Pearson, seconded by Connealy, the Board authorized the Zoning Administrator to remove the **moratorium on Conditional Use Permits** for Solar Facilities. By roll call vote: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays – none. Motion passed. A moratorium remains in place on Conditional Use Permits for commercial wind systems.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT:

Life Saving Awards were presented to: First Responders of the Craig and Oakland Rescue Squad; Chief Deputy James Buck of the Burt County Sheriff's Department; and Andrew Donawa, Burt County Emergency Manager. The awards were given in recognition of the quick action these individuals took to save a life on November 11, 2020.

Upon motion by Pearson, seconded by Swanson, the Board authorized the change of the **Emergency Management Vehicle Use Policy**. By roll call vote: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays – none. Motion passed. It was noted that the vehicle is for work use only; however, Donawa is allowed to drive the vehicle home at night so that he can quickly respond to an emergency. There will be no IRS vehicle taxes assessed because this is a marked emergency vehicle.


Andrew Donawa, Emergency Manager informed the Board of three (3) system needs recommended from the State of Nebraska: (1) AlertSense is a public notification system, annual cost \$3,500.00; (2) Emergency Reporting is a system that is used for incident documentation, annual cost \$1,000.00; (3) CAD system, annual cost \$2,109.00. The systems are All web-based, so there will be no need for additional equipment. Upon motion by Morrow, seconded by Richards, the board approved the annual payments for the three systems. By Roll Call Vote: Ayes – Morrow, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays – Swanson. Motion passed. The annual payments will be paid out of Inheritance Fund (2700) for this 2020-2021 FY, in FY 2021-2022 the payments will be budgeted through the Emergency Manager's Office Budget (0100-693).

ROADS:

The Board appointed Ann Chytka as **Burt County Highway Superintendent for 2021** upon motion by Connealy, seconded by Morrow. By roll call vote: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays – none. Motion passed.

County Road M east of Hwy. 77: Chairman Schold signed the engineering contract with Mainelli Wagner & Assoc. A contract with Midwest Veterinary Services for State of Nebraska Economic Opportunity Program Grant for the road project was reviewed and





Striping: Ann reported that she again asked Highway Signing Inc. for lower pricing for striping various roads in Spring 2021. The board approved Chytka to accept the cost of \$1,060.00/mile, for edge and center lines, from Highway Signing Inc. Upon motion by Webster, seconded by Richards. By Roll Call Vote: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays-none. Motion passed. Hard surfaced roads needing the striping will be decided upon toward spring 2021 when the weather is favorable for striping projects.



PUBLIC COMMENTS (2): (1) Mark Smith thanked the board for supporting all of the improvements/changes that the Emergency Manager's office is doing to support Emergency Services. (2) Bill Price expressed appreciation to the board for leaving the moratorium on CUPs for wind; he encouraged the board to talk to individuals who have operated large wind turbines.

Discussion of 2021 Legislation: LB310 is a bill that would sharply reduce the inheritance tax over a several-year period. The County will submit letters to Sen. Ben Hansen and to the Revenue Committee to "Oppose elimination or reduction of county's share of inheritance taxes." The opposition letter reads:

LB310 OPPOSITION

The Burt County Board of Supervisors stand in firm opposition to LB310 and any reduction in Nebraska's Inheritance tax. The Fund is absolutely necessary for the well-being of Burt County fiscally by helping keep property taxes from going much higher.

We, like most other counties, use the Fund as our 'Reserve' in case of emergencies and for unplanned expenses that cannot wait until the next budget process. We also use the Fund to lower the tax levy at budget time. If we lose our inheritance Fund, we will have no choice but to raise property taxes to build a significant emergency Fund.

We are at the mercy of any crisis caused by wind, rain, flooding, hail, tornadoes, and the ever-present threat of an unplanned devastating legal case.

We request you resist the urge to lower taxes by forcing counties to raise theirs. We respectfully request that our opposition be included as part of the public record.

Examples of Burt County's use of our Inheritance Tax Funds: TAX RELIEF: If it were not for the use of inheritance dollars to lower our levy, the county tax rate would need to be increased in order to maintain the cash reserve and services. PUBLIC SAFETY: Used to pay annual fee for emergency software that helps keep our citizens safe. COURTS: Used to pay for a variety of costs of a large murder trial. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT: Economic Development dues are paid by the County, this helps offset the dues for our local Subdivisions (Cities/Villages) within Burt County that participate. COMPREHENSIVE PLANNNING: paid for a new (10 year) County Comprehensive Plan. TOWNSHIP SUPPORT: Used to help 5 townships with start-up costs when they re-organized in 2019. ROADS: helped pay for road projects in which the County was petitioned by a Township to help with. NATURAL DISASTER: To help cover costs of emergency road repairs after devastating flooding. COURTHOUSE INFRASTRUCTURE: Used to pay for new wiring/updates to our technology infrastructure. (new phone system, new data rack and addition of data ports through-out 4 floors of the





building.) COURTHOUSE MAINTENANCE: Tuckpointing, new windows and new doors with handicap accessibility for our 100 year old Courthouse.

Application for a **Commercial Renovation Grant**: The application is from Josh Eriksen, HB Ventures, for new windows/glass door(s) on the west side of 415 S. 13th St, Tekamah. Patty Plugge, Burt County Economic Development, reported that the BCEDC board had reviewed the request; she explained that currently the business is 'Cottonwood




Storage' and these grant funds don't allow for renovations to storage businesses due to efforts to keep storage buildings off of main street; however the owner reported that he is going to convert the business and put commercial space at the main street frontage of the building and move the storage to the rear of the building with a separate back entrance. BCEDC recommended their approval with the following (2) stipulations; (1) the business owner will remove the storage sign from the main street entrance and (2) the storage entrance will be a rear entrance separate from the commercial spaces up front. The Burt County Board approved the release of \$14,500.00 from County Fund 0900. Approved upon motion by Morrow, seconded by Richards. By roll call vote: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays – none. Motion passed.

ROADS: A **temporary road closure request** was submitted by Master's Hand for a summer event. Speaking during public comment: Tyler Brummond and Trey O'Daniel, a partner with NE-IA Helicopter – O'Daniel explained they would like to build a runway & hanger for up to two ag planes, fuel tanker will be kept onsite during the spraving season. O'Daniel addressed noise concerns, stating that their aircraft is only for ag use during the spraying season and the aircraft measures ~82 decibels at 100 ft. directly above. Brummond confirmed that efforts were taken to locate the spray plane portion of their business to the Tekamah Municipal Airport, but finding no resolve, they feel they need to move forward with their own private airstrip instead. (2) Mark VanDerHart, Tekamah Airport Joint Zoning expressed that this proposed airstrip poses no problems for the airport's zoning overlay district, and he is aware of the issue that NE-IA has had with their efforts of using the Tekamah Airport and he understands from the business point of view that NE-IA needs to move forward with this request to build their own airstrip. Ann Chytka, Burt County Zoning- reported that the County Planning commission approved the airstrip/2 ag planes. There was no opposition to the CUP. Chairman Schold declared the public hearing closed at 9:49 A.M., and the Board went back into regular session. Motion was made by Morrow to approve the Conditional Use Permit for Kevin Brummond for a private airstrip to be





built in 25 & 36-22-11, Burt County, NE, Richards seconded the motion, motion passed with roll call vote as follows: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays-none.

P&C Insurance: Kevin Brenneis requested to visit with the board about submitting an agent of record change to Traveler's Insurance. The County will be entering their third year of a current three-year contract with Traveler's, but since they'd entered the contract, the agent that was serving the County has left. Brenneis explained that he can provide that 'agent service' that the County is lacking since their LMC Insurance broker left. No action was taken at this time, County Attorney Talbot is going to check into the process.

Chairman Schold asked Jon Dockhorn, Manager of Burt County Public Power District, to attend today's meeting and explain what distribution would look like from any local renewable energy generation. Dockhorn explained energy generation vs consumption. Dockhorn confirmed that there is no guarantee that local consumption can use all renewable energy that may be generated in Burt County; simply put, if local consumption is not high enough, the extra energy generated will not all be consumed locally.



seconded by Connealy. By roll call vote: Ayes -Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays - none.



COMMUNICATION: Northeast Nebraska Community Action Partnership (NENCAP) – 2020 Annual Report (Oct. 2019-Sept. 2020)

P&C Insurance: The County will be entering their third year of a current three-year contract with Traveler's, but since they'd entered the contract, the agent that was serving the County has left. The board voted to submit an agent of record change to Travelers Insurance; if Travelers accepts the request, the servicing agency will be switched from LMC Insurance over to Brenneis Insurance. The board voted to sign and submit the request; upon motion by Connealy, seconded by Swanson. By roll call vote: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays – none.

Shredding services: Upon motion by Webster, seconded by Morrow, the board approved an agreement with Security Shredding Services (Laurel, NE) for on-site shredding. Approved by roll call vote: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays- none. Security Shredding is going to do a one-time purge service in March for a fee of \$35.00 per 65 gallon tote; the County will then continue with bi-monthly services. The 'regular' services will include lockable 65 gallon totes that are provided rent free and left on-site, the County will choose the number of totes they'd like to have on-site. The only fees will be \$35.00 to shred a 65 gallon tote; i.e. 1 tote=\$35.00, 2 totes=\$70.00, etc.

Conditional Use Permit: Sandhills Energy submitted a Conditional Use Application to build Burt County Solar, LLC, a 250 MW Solar PV Electrical Generation Facility in Sections 1,2,3,11,12,13,14 & 15 -Twp 20 -R 11E and in Sections 35 & 36 -Twp 21 -R 11E. Michael Knapp, COO Sandhills Energy gave a presentation about the project to the Burt County board today. Also present to answer questions on behalf of the company were: Eric Johnson, President Sandhills Energy and David Levy, Attorney. Burt County Planning Commission held a public hearing and approved the application at their March 1, 2021 meeting.

Chairman Schold opened a Public Hearing at 10:04 a.m. for the conditional use permit. Supervisor Connealy abstained from comments and voting due to a conflict of interest. Speaking during public comment:

(1) OPPOSED: JoAnn Bachtell, 291 CoRd. 45, Tekamah – Expressed concerns of only money being discussed with the project; she spoke on behalf of small acreage owners and those who just want a small piece of Country life, she wanted their concerns to matter as much as the money matters. JoAnn also shared a letter from Fish and Wildlife Services regarding concerns for the wildlife losing their habitat.

(2) NEUTRAL: Mark VanDerHart, Tekamah Airport Joint Zoning – expressed that this proposed project poses no problems for the airport's zoning overlay district; the company worked well with their board to address and plan for any areas of concern their board had. (3) NEUTRAL: Bill Price - 1615 CoRd. 10, Lyons, NE -expressed that he had previously cited information with regards to renewable energy generation driving up electricity prices. He shared that he feels that when a new generation facility is considered, a more efficient use of space would be to instead build a non-renewable plant (i.e. a nuclear plant) that could generate more electricity at a lower cost.

Written Public Comment turned in before the Hearing: (1) OPPOSED: Craig and JoAnn Bachtell, 291 CoRd. 45, Tekamah.

Chairman Schold declared the public hearing closed at 10:19 A.M., and the Board went back into regular session.

Motion by Morrow: motion to approve the Conditional Use Permit for Burt County Solar, LLC with three (3) conditions that must be agreed upon among the following parties: Burt County Roads, Burt County Zoning, Burt County Board and Burt County Solar, LLC. Clarification and Planning must be worked out concerning the following: (1) road fencing placement; (2) the third party who will be involved with road agreements; (3) clarification of the number of years of the project concerning tax payments. Motion was Seconded by Pearson. Roll Call Vote: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster and Schold. Nays – None. Abstained from Voting: Connealy. Motion passed.

Discussions noted for the conditions to the CUP:

(1) fencing placement regarding distance from road and tree placement when trees will be put in: suggested during discussions.... "from the edge of the R.O.W. there will be 20 feet to the first row of trees, 6 feet and a second row of trees, then 18 feet to the fence, then 12 feet to the Solar Panel.

(2) The Burt County board wants to make sure they have a say in choosing who will be acting as the liaison during the Road Agreements.

(3) The drafted CUP application referenced the project as a 20 year project; Burt County Board wants it clear that Tax Payments will be paid during the duration of the project, not just for 20 years as the draft kept stating.

Next Step: Parties (Burt County and Sandhills Energy/Burt County Solar) will work out the agreed upon conditions stated in the motion. When all is agreeable, the agreements will be written out and attached to the Application for Conditional Use Permit. County Board Chair Schold has authority to sign the CUP after all conditions are met and attached.

Connealy made a motion to go into *Closed Session*, Webster seconded, and the motion passed with All Ayes. Chairman Schold declared at 11:13 A.M. the board went into closed session *for the protection of public interest to discuss litigations*. Swanson made a motion to come out of Closed Session, Connealy seconded, and motion passed with All Ayes. Chairman Schold declared the public meeting back in regular session at 11:32 A.M. No action was taken during closed session.

County Clerk, Sarah Freidel brought it to the attention of the board that the County needs to establish a credit card policy, also, there are department requests for the use of credit cards. For travel use and situations where invoicing is not an option, the board approved the following (4) credit cards all with \$2,000.00 credit limits: (1) Building and Grounds, to be held and used by Bruce Nathan; (2) County Clerk, to be locked in the Clerk's office for use on-site by officials and department heads that have the need; (3) Highway Superintendent, to be held by Ann Chytka for use by her department; (4) Emergency Manager, to be held and used by Andrew Donawa during his travel and for department needs. The (4) credit cards were approved upon motion by Connealy, seconded by Richards. By roll call vote: Ayes- Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays- none. The cards will all be under one fnbo Business Visa account for Burt County Courthouse. The board instructed the departments to do all they could to have their vendors invoice the County for purchases/services and advised that all





purchases using credit cards must have itemized receipts attached to credit card invoice with their claims. An official Credit Card use policy following §13-610 will be drafted and adopted via Resolution at a future meeting.

Redistricting 2021: Burt County's Supervisor districts will need to be reviewed and possibly adjusted following the 2020 Census. The board approved to have gWorks complete the redistricting for Burt County; upon motion by Pearson, seconded by Webster. By roll call vote: Ayes -Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays – none. gWorks will perform the service via their basic plan for \$4,550.00 which includes district data import, comparisons, revision of district lines and 4 hours of 1-to-1 access for the County Clerk to work with their team to establish final Supervisor district lines.

PUBLIC COMMENTS: (1) Bill Price - 1615 CoRd. 10, Lyons, NE: Presented a one page petition with 'signatures of opposition to commercial wind and support of recall efforts for Supervisors whom vote to allow commercial wind into the County'.

ROADS – Ann Chytka, Highway Superintendent:

Skid Loader Rental: The lease on the skid loader is up for renewal; Ann reported that the road department will lease from NMC for 3000 hours at annual cost of \$6,300.00. *Road Striping*: Chytka shared a map of the planned roads for 2021 striping.





Summer hours: Chytka reported that the outside road crews will be starting their 4/10 schedule.

Financing: Chairman Schold signed Washington County Bank paperwork for the line-ofcredit being used for the FEMA projects.

Cell Phone: Chytka asked the board to approve the purchase of a County Cell Phone for her because she is on call 24 hrs/day, she is finding that she is conducting too much County business with her personal cell phone. The Board approved purchase of a cell phone for the Highway Superintendent due to that position being on call 24/7; approved upon motion by Richards, seconded by Connealy. By roll call vote: Ayes – Morrow, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays- Swanson. Motion passed.

Project updates: The board requested that Ann look into the cost for placing a guardrail at the County Road V bridge.

Patty Plugge with Burt County Economic Development presented two (2) grant applications, Plugge reported that BCEDC board had reviewed the requests and recommended their approval for both: (1) Fund 0900, **Commercial Reno Grant** for Nelson's Food Pride for a new sign on the outside of their commercial building in downtown Oakland, \$2,327.72 was approved upon motion by Pearson, seconded by Connealy. By roll call vote: Ayes – 7. Nays – none. Motion passed. (2) fund 0990, **Lodging Tax Grant** for Tri-County Saddle Club for advertising for June 4-5, 2021 rodeo, \$500.00 was approved upon motion by Morrow, seconded by Richards. By roll call vote: Ayes – 7. Nays – none. Motion passed.

Emergency Management:

Andrew Donawa updated the Board about the problems that are happening with Radio Communications between dispatch & emergency services and dispatch & law enforcement. Several individuals from the Burt County emergency services and Sheriff's office explained the radio-to-radio static that is causing problems for them when they are out in the field providing emergency services throughout the County. The infrastructure of the Radio Communications needs addressed as soon as possible; the individual departments are responsible for their handhelds and/or any of their repeaters, but Donawa explained that the County needs to address the main infrastructure being the main 911 radio console and the repeaters on the towers throughout the County. The radio console at the 911 dispatch is 35+ years old and needs replaced, the costs for this alone would likely exceed \$190,000.00. Donawa also reported that the last work done to repeaters was in 2014 and this is also something that cannot be put off any longer; the repeaters on the towers need checked over and probable work as well. Upon motion by Connealy, seconded by Richards, the board approved for tri-state communications to do an emergency review of the infrastructure of the radio system and authorized repairs not to exceed \$15,000.00. By roll call vote: Ayes - Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays - none. Motion passed. Donawa and the Sheriff's department will work together to oversee the review and prepare a request for proposal.

Extension Office updates:

Mary Loftis introduced Angi Heller, Zone 8 Engagement Zone Coordinator. Angi shared a handout explaining her roles with the Extension Program. Angi also updated the board about the two vacant positions currently in Burt County due to two extension





educators retiring in 2020; she reported that at this time, the Nebraska Extension does plan to replace both of those positions.

Jenn Peterson shared a powerpoint of a virtual tour of the Burt County Courthouse; she explained that they are using this to show potential candidates around the Courthouse.

Jennifer Hansen visited with the board about how expenditures flow through the Extension office and updated the board on an account they are going to eliminate.

Upon motion by Richards, seconded by Swanson, the Board approved the reappointment of Roger Kirschenman to serve a second term as the Decatur representative on the **Veterans Service Committee**. By roll call vote: Ayes –Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays – none. Motion passed.

Pearson moved the Board recess at 11:41 AM for *Board of Equalization*, Connealy seconded, motion passed with All Ayes. The Burt County Board of Supervisors reconvened at 11:46 AM, upon motion by Richards, seconded by Connealy, with All Ayes. See separate BOE 3/26/2021 minutes.

Board Members Pearson and Connealy moved to adopt a **County Credit Card Policy** via Resolution 2021-07. By roll call vote: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays – none.

RESOLUTION 2021-07

Credit Card Policy

WHEREAS, by the County Board of Supervisors of Burt County, Nebraska, that the following will be Burt County's Credit Card Policy:

<u>ADMINISTRATION OF CREDIT CARDS</u> - The County Administrator (County Clerk's office) shall keep record of who/which department has been issued a credit card and their credit limits.

ISSUING A CREDIT CARD – Approval of Credit card issued will be upon motion by the Burt County Board of Supervisors during a regular board meeting. Cards will be issued to the approved individual via the County Administrator (County Clerk's office) under the Burt County Courthouse business Visa program with First National Bank Omaha (FNBO). Upon termination or suspension of employment of the employee approved and issued a County credit card, such individual shall return the purchasing card to the County.

PURCHASES – All purchases on the County's credit cards must be for valid County purchases. No personal expenditures may be charged on the County credit card, even with the intent to reimburse the County. All purchases shall attempt to be made using Burt County's tax-exemption status; a Form 13 is available via the County Administrator (County Clerk's office).

<u>RECEIPTS</u> – All charges made on the County credit card shall be substantiated with an itemized invoice/receipt. Internet purchases shall be documented with a receipt printed at the time of order. Telephone orders shall be documented through fax or email receipts. Itemized receipts will then be balanced with and attached to the Credit Card Statement when turning in the claim for payment.

PERMITTED CHARGES – Lodging Expenses for training travel for County employees may be charged on the County credit

card. Gas expenses for County vehicles may be charged on the County credit card; vehicle number and current mileage shall be written upon the receipt that accompanies the claim. No laundry, no tobacco, no alcoholic beverages, no entertainment may be paid for on the County credit card. No meal expenses – for meals, see Burt County's meal purchases policy *(employee letter_IRS compliance)*. No expenses of a spouse or other non-employee may be charged on the County credit card.

EMPLOYEE ACCESS – Department heads will make the decision to allow employees access to the County's credit card.

<u>REBATES</u> – Any rebates will be issued into the County's general fund.

LOST OR STOLEN CARD – If the card is lost or stolen, you are required to report the loss to the credit card company and to the County Administrator (County Clerk's office).

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Board of Supervisors of Burt County, Nebraska, that All employees who use a County credit card will be responsible for the charges made. If an employee makes a charge to a County credit card and does not produce valid receipt, the employee may be subject to personal payment of the charges. Any inappropriate use of the County's credit cards will be grounds for disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal. The responsibility for safety and integrity of the County credit card belongs to the employee or department head.

We believe that County Administrators are selected to conduct the work of the people of the County, not forward their own or special interests. The undersigned citizens also agree to support a recall effort for any and all County Officials that approve commercial and industrial scale projects that do not reflect the will of the people of Burt County." Mr. Price turned in five signed petition pages.

COMMUNICATION (2): (1) 2020 Tax Sale Certification from Robin Olson, Burt Co Treasurer per §77-1813. (2) The deed for the (Region 5/6) Decatur Tower Property has been filed and the property now belongs to Burt County. Mowing of the property will be overseen by the





Roads Dept. Andrew Donawa, Emergency Manager, will get this added to our property insurance policy; Donawa also reported that we currently are not using the tower, so he will have the power shut off.

Building and Grounds safety: Bruce Nathan will order 'keep off' signs to anchor into the concrete around the tank.

Mary Loftis gave an update on the extension educator position (cropping and water systems team). She reported that interviews were held, but all applicants turned down the position, so the position will remain open and they'll re-post.

Chad Thies and Stephanie Vanous, representative from Zelle Human Resources discussed services they could offer the County. The County Board suggested the Zelle team members visit with the County Officials and Department Heads to see if they have any interest in utilizing the services of Zelle within their departments.

Radio Communications:

Bob Cain with Tri-State Communications did an emergency review of Burt County's communications equipment (dispatch console, towers / repeaters / antennas / microwave) that are used by the County Law Enforcement and Emergency Services. Mr. Cain reported that immediate replacement is needed for the dispatch console, Sheriff Nick expressed to the Board that replacement of this piece of equipment is of an emergency nature. Upon motion by Pearson, seconded by Morrow, the board approved for tri-state communications to do emergency repairs and/or replacement of the 911 dispatch radio console up to \$90,000.00 (including \$15,000.00 previously authorized on March 26, 2021). By roll call vote: Ayes - Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays none. Motion passed. Spending authority for authorized amount in FY20-21 budget will have to come from the Inheritance Fund (2700), with repayment back to the fund being budgeted in FY21-22 budget. Emergency Manager, Andrew Donawa and the Sheriff Nick will work with Tri-State Communications to prepare a request for proposal that will address the rest of the system needs in next year's (FY 21-22) budget. Sealed bids can then be let for next fiscal year budgets.

Burt County Emergency Communication Committee requested to have one Burt County Supervisor be on their board, Carl Pearson volunteered.

Patty Plugge with Burt County Economic Development presented two (2) applications for Fund 0900, Private Foundation Grants; Plugge reported that BCEDC board had reviewed the requests and recommended their approval for both. According to the language of the grant, monies are awarded for up to 50% cost. The two (2) applications presented were for consideration for **Demolition Grant(s)**, both from Three Rivers Housing Development Corp.: (1) for asbestos abatement for house at 901 L. Update from Gina Uhing – Elkhorn Logan Valley Public Health Dept.: May 2021 ELVPHD was told that the Governor is going to pull state funding for Public Health Departments; funding for General expenses will cease on June 30, personnel



funding will go only through July. It was recommended they go to the Counties in their districts to seek funding because the Counties will receive pandemic money. Also, the Governor is ending State of Emergency on June 30; so all of their funding will likely come to end. She wants feedback to help put together a proposal of what amount of money their health department can receive from the County in order to continue to operate; they feel they want to ask for a percentage of the Federal Rescue funds from each of their Counties in order to continue to provide their services. The board recommended they discuss pledging money after the final guidelines have been released; the last meeting in July may be a good time to touch base.

Zelle HR – Chad Thies and Steph Vanous: They'd met with offices; their feedback was a consistent theme of interest in employee engagement. With their help in going through the Policy manual, a lot of great feedback can come from that. Their services/price quoted: \$4,000.00 per month for six months of full services. For the Handbook consulting only: \$7,500.00. The board would like to discuss with their department heads before making any decisions.

Radio Communications update from Sheriff Eric Nick: The new Radio Base Console costs came in at \$69,385.00. Wiring is being worked on before installation can be completed; they expect mid-August installation. Phase 2 – the new Radios for Burt County Sheriff's Dept.; seven handhelds and seven vehicle repeaters will fall into the FY 2021-2022 Budget. Sheriff Nick got together with the municipal Police Chiefs and wrote a Grant application to Nielsen Foundation to help pay for their radio equipment costs that will come within phase 2.

The 911 cabinetry/desk system that was planned for Phase 2, was purchased from Watson Consoles by Sheriff Nick with remaining FY 2020-2021 budget funds. The board questioned the claim amount and the bidding process; Sheriff explained that the amount remained under the §23-3108 purchasing bid requirements and it was a unique purchase therefore he could not collect three informal bids. The board requested better communication before such large purchases in the future.

Andrew Donawa -**EM Vehicle**: Currently drives a 2003 Ford Expedition with ~140,000 miles that is consistently costing money to keep running; he has had two mechanics advise him to replace this vehicle. Donawa is asking the board to consider a municipal leasing option for a pick-up (Chevy Silverado 1500 4x4) with topper and all emergency equipment upfit. His radios can/will transfer to a new vehicle. He can get municipal lease purchase from First Capital Equipment Leasing or GM Financial for \$55,000.00. There is a unit in Missouri Valley, IA that can be obtained today. The board approved the purchase be made through GM Financial Leasing Program, making quarterly payments for 4 years; motion by Richards, seconded by Webster. By Roll Call Vote: Ayes – Morrow, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays – Swanson. Motion approved; the EM Vehicle will be purchased.

Patty Plugge with Burt County Economic Development presented two (2) grant applications, Plugge reported that BCEDC board had reviewed the requests and recommended their approval for both: (#1) Fund 0900, **Commercial Reno Grant** for Swedish Heritage Museum (Oakland) for siding (partial building), \$6,208.80 (50% of the low bid) was approved upon motion by Richards, seconded by Connealy. By roll call vote: Ayes – 7. Nays – none. Motion passed. (#2) Fund 0900, **Demolition Grant** (#2) for Sam & Lori Titus to demo trailer court off Hwy. 32, Tekamah, \$6,140.00 (50% of the low bid) was approved upon motion by Richards, seconded by Connealy. Patty also shared (3) additional guidelines that the Burt County Economic Development Board will be adding to the Reno and Demo Grant Applications. 1. Demolition Grant – Currently we only require one bid. It is suggested that if the applicant is going to do the work themselves and remits their own bid, they would be required to provide an additional bid from a commercial contractor. 2. Renovation Grant – There is currently no limit on the number of times someone can apply. The suggested line would read: Each applicant for renovation on a commercial building will be limited to a maximum of \$15,000.00. 3. For both grants, the County Board of Supervisors reserves the right to seek an independent bid at their discretion. The board also has the ultimate authority in granting funds for each project.

Sheriff Eric Nick, Burt County Sheriff – Gave an update on the Department and brought concerns to the board about staffing shortages. He asked to raise his budget authority to cover two more positions; the board responded that they'll need to work the numbers with Mytty Consulting (budget authority).

Fred Mytty (Mytty Consulting) met with the Board to **discuss the 2021-2022 budget**. Mytty presented initial numbers and discussed options to keep tax asking down; i.e. line of credit for 1 year road projects. Final numbers will be discussed and decided upon *after* the valuation is available August 20th.

(3) Cheri Johansen, Craig EMS Captain.



Dr. Kelly Lechtenberg from **Midwest Veterinary Services**, **Inc. (MVS)** visited with the board to explained programs hosted and procedures that are performed at his facilities; he also gave project expansion updates for the facility. The **expansion of MVS**, operating under the name of Central States Research Centre, Inc., located at 1290 County Road M, Oakland, Burt County, Nebraska, to increase testing capacity, including virus isolation and identification, which will provide a Biosafety Level 2 diagnostic laboratory to serve residents in northeast Nebraska within a 90 mile radius of Oakland. This project entails the construction of a 2,000 sq. ft. plant expansion (costing \$1,000,000 and funded entirely by the Business) which will not change the size or capacity of the existing facility by more than 20% and not land use. He has hopes that the project will be completed within a one-year period. No residents, businesses, or farms will be displaced as a result of this project.

Board Member Morrow moved to accept the bid from Steve Harris Construction, Swanson seconded the motion, roll call vote followed: Ayes- Morrow, Swanson, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays – none. Absent - Richards. This road project is being funded via State of Nebraska Economic Opportunity Program Grant.

Jeff Christensen with Northeast Nebraska Economic Development District (NENEDD) further explained another funding opportunity for the laboratory part of the MVS project that could potentially be funded with the **Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)** program through the Nebraska Department of Economic Development. The total project cost being submitted for Grant Funding is approximately \$347,000 of which \$340,000 is for equipment and working capital, and \$7,000 for grant administration. The \$340,000 performance-based loan will be forgiven entirely upon meeting the various job creation and maintenance requirements, as the business will create four additional FTE jobs, that primarily benefit low-to-moderate income persons, above its existing baseline employment of 42 FTE positions. All positions are to be maintained for a period of at least one year. The CDBG Grant money will have to be run through Burt County's Budget process. A New fund will need to be set up within the County's budget via a FY21-22 Budget Amendment if the grant application gets approval. Christensen explained that the first step in starting the Grant process is Burt County must enter into an agreement with NENEDD for an environmental review on the MVS facility; motion was made by Connealy and seconded by Pearson to sign the paperwork for the needed agreement. Roll Call Vote: Ayes -Morrow, Swanson, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays - none. Absent - Richards. Chairman signed the agreement with NENEDD.



Co.Rd. 25 Minimum Maint. Road Closure Request: August 27, 2021 Todd Feltz discussed with the Burt County Board vacation/abandonment of this MM road between CR.K and CR.L. John Hundahl, Silvercreek TWP, reported to the Burt County Board that Silvercreek township has received request from Feltz that the Township take steps toward closure of this MM road. The township discussed this request and offered public comment time during their meeting for the public to comment about the request. Hundahl reported that there was no public comment about this road closure and the Silvercreek TWP board voted to request to the Burt County Board that this MM road be vacated. Supervisor Dave Schold reported that the Craig Fire and Rescue had some concerns with this possible closure. County Attorney Talbot advised the Burt County Board that there are procedures to follow for such request to be considered and as far as he can tell, none of those procedures have been followed. As of today, the Burt County Board has received no official request and no action will be taken by the County Board for any such road closure process.

Nick Seery, Milestone Surveying requested to discuss surveying education, records and mapping with the County Board- (a) Education: Seery offered to come into the Courthouse to provide a day of education about survey records and how each office and entity uses the records; he explained that he felt there are a significant amount of new people and he could help all to understand the role of the records and how all can access and use the surveys. He did gain permission to invite Municipal employees as well, as they also would gain benefits from the education. The County Board did not have a problem with coming into the Courthouse during business hours to provide the education. (b) Digitizing Survey Records: Seery explained he is doing a digitizing and indexing job for Thurston County and offered to do the same for Burt County; if the County was interested in doing so, he could do the job while passing along savings via cost-share between the two



Counties. Seery explained that he would scan, digitize, index, and make the records available to be published online for public access. The County budget has available funds for preservation and maintenance of records if they choose to move forward with such a project. Seery will prepare a proposal than can be considered at a future County Board meeting. (c) Seery explained a mapping project he has been discussing with the County Assessor's office; it would be ideal to get the entire County done, but he is currently going to complete working up one Township in order to get an idea of a cost to complete the same work for the entire County. Nick Seery is not the Burt County Surveyor, but explained that none of what he is offering falls under a County Surveyor's statutory duties; if any of the work is wanted, the County would have costs whether their own Elected County Surveyor perform the work or he did the work.

Connealy made a motion to go into *Closed Session*, Morrow seconded, and the motion passed with Ayes-6, Absent-1. Chairman Schold declared at 10:27 A.M. the board went into closed session *for the protection of public interest to discuss litigations*. Swanson made a motion to come out of Closed Session, Webster seconded, and motion passed with Ayes-6, Absent-1. Chairman Schold declared the public meeting back in regular session at 10:44 A.M. No action was taken during closed session.

Mark VanDerHart, from Tekamah Airport Zoning, asked permission to use the 1st floor Courthouse conference room after hours for airport zoning meetings. The request was denied due to a County Policy (noted 3.31.2016) establishing that afterhours use is approved only for Courthouse offices due to security.





RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING CHIEF ELECTED OFFICIAL TO SIGN AN APPLICATION FOR CDBG FUNDS

Whereas, the Burt County, Nebraska, is an eligible unit of general local government authorized to file an application under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 as amended for Small Cities Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program, made available through the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act (CARES Act), to prepare, prevent and respond to COVID-19, and,

Burt County is requesting \$347,000 in CDBG funds for Economic Development, of which \$340,000 is for equipment and working capital, and \$7,000 for grant administration. The \$340,000 performance-based loan will be forgiven entirely upon meeting the various job creation and maintenance requirements, as the business will create four additional FTE jobs, that primarily benefit low-to-moderate income persons, above its existing baseline employment of 24 FTE positions. All positions are to be maintained for a period of at least one year.

The economic development project will involve the expansion of an existing business, Midwest Veterinary Services, Inc., operating under the name of Central States Research Centre, Inc. (the "Business"), located at 1290 County Road M, Oakland, Burt County, Nebraska, to fund working capital and purchase equipment to increase testing capacity, including





virus isolation and identification, which will provide a Biosafety Level 2 diagnostic laboratory related to COVID-19 to serve residents in northeast Nebraska within a 90 mile radius of Oakland.

Not part of the CDBG funding and not included in the project cost is the construction of a 2,000 sq. ft. plant expansion (costing \$1,000,000 and funded entirely by the Business) which will not change the size or capacity of the existing facility by more than 20% and not land use. The project will be completed within a two-year period. No residents, businesses, or farms will be displaced as a result of this project. Total project cost and grant administration is \$1,347,000.

WHEREAS, Burt County, Nebraska approved an Application under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 as amended for Small Cities Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program, made available through the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act (Cares Act), on October 12, 2021, at its regular board meeting; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the 2021 Administration Manual Community Development Block Grant Program, State of Nebraska Chapter 12, Page 13, "subrecipients should promptly deposit all CDBG project receipts to the proper bank account and record as a receipt in the accounting system. Submit CDBG drawdowns only as required to pay immediate obligations. The Department will consider the subrecipient in violation of the requirements if excessive amounts of cash (over \$1,000) are on hand for over five business days. The subrecipient must return the excess funds to the Department"; and,

WHEREAS, Chapter 24 CFR 570.489 Program administrative requirements of the federal system indicates that "the State must use procedures to minimize the time elapsing between the transfer of grant funds and disbursement of funds by the State to units of general local government. States must also have procedures in place, and units of general local government must use these procedures to minimize the time elapsing between the transfer of funds by the State and disbursement for CDBG activities"; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the requirements for prompt disbursements, the county does hereby approve receipts and disbursements to be made following review by the Chairman of The Board and directing the County Clerk to prepare a Warrant authorizing the disbursement of funds as soon as possible in compliance of the statutory references sited herein; and,

WHEREAS, the County Board is authorizing disbursements of the funds following the receipt of the same pursuant to this Resolution and a Warrant will be prepared to authorize disbursements within the five days of receipt; and,

WHEREAS, Burt County will consider the Warrant and final authorization at its next regular board meeting when claims are presented to be approved by the board.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Burt County, that upon receipt of CDBG funds, the Chairman of The Board is authorized to sign off on a Warrant prepared by the County Clerk for the disbursements of funds following receipt and that the claim will be presented at the next regular board meeting for approval of the disbursements. Disbursements are made pursuant to the requirements of state and federal law that funds be disbursed within five days of the date of receipt. This resolution is a combination of the requirements of the federal and state law regarding the disbursements and meant to assist the economic development projects in the county.

Road Report and Hearing Set for Petition to vacate Road #321:

Ann Chytka, Burt County Highway Superintendent presented her Road Study of Public Road #321 (Co.Rd. 25 between Co.Rd. K and L). The following main points were made within the report: (a) this road is designated a township minimum maintenance road located in Silver Creek Township; (b) there are currently 3 property owners adjoining this road; (c) there is currently 1 driveway on the minimum maintenance road, but she believes property owner is currently using a private drive to access his property and not utilizing the minimum maintenance road; (d) this is the third (3) time this has come before the Board of Supervisors to vacate or abandon said road; (1) April 1991 - Hwy Supt Don Neary in favor of vacating, but after public hearing it was denied (2) Oct. 2015 - Hwy Supt Peggy Smith recommended vacate, but after public hearing it was denied again. (3) Oct./Nov. 2021 – the third and current petition; (e) based on facts listed in (a)-(d)- this road by the general 'traveling' public would serve no purpose; (f) her concern- safety of life and property, according to Craig Fire & Rescue, they average 2 calls per year to this location and the concern is if emergency services were needed, having this road vacated would hinder their efforts; (g) her concern – vacating this portion of County Road 25 would isolate a tract of land.

Chytka reported that based on her study, she is not in favor of vacating this road. The next step is to hold a public hearing.

Resolution 2021-29 was passed upon motions by Morrow and Connealy, with roll call vote as follows: Ayes – Morrow, Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays-none.

RESOLUTION #2021-29

WHEREAS, upon order by the Burt County Board of Supervisors and in accordance with section 39-1722 of the Nebraska Revised Statutes, Ann Chyka the Burt County Highway Superintendent has made a study of Public Road #321 located between sections 31 and 32, township 22, range 10E of the sixth pm. Described as follows; Commencing at the SE corner of Sec. 31, Twp 22, Rg. 10E; thence northerly to the NE corner of Sec. 31, Twp 22, Rg. 10E. Now commonly known as County Road 25 running north and south between County Roads K and L in Burt County Nebraska.

AND WHEREAS, there are three property owners currently abutting the described road. One resident has a driveway off the minimum maintenance road and the other resident has access off of Co Rd L. The main concern I have is for the safety of life and property. In speaking with Craig Fire and Rescue they average 2 calls per year to this location. It concerns me that if fire or rescue was needed and that there would be a gate across the road hindering their efforts.

AND WHEREAS, based on these facts use of this road by the general "Traveling" public would serve no purpose but for emergency vehicles it could pose a problem. Todd Feltz is requesting this road be vacated, which means that the roads existence is terminated by direct action of public authorities and the land reverts back to the land owners.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Burt County Board of Supervisors that a public hearing be held to take comments from the public concerning the vacating all or part of this road, such hearing to be held on December 14th,2021 at 9:45 am in the boardroom of the courthouse in Tekamah, Nebraska.



ROADS: Ann Chytka, Highway Superintendent

Complaint: Lyle Redding filed a written complaint about an odor around County Road R around Elm Creek; he wanted to make a report and asked that it never happens again. *Trees in R.O.W.:* Chytka reported that she will send letters to landowners when/if she receives complaints about trees being a problem in the Road Right-of-Way. She explained trees in the R.O.W. are landowners responsibility to address per Neb.Rev.Stat. §39-1812





Cleaning Ditches: Chytka reported that she has created a billing formula for cleaning ditches for Townships.

Bridges: projects noted from the 2019 bridge inspection reports are being addressed by the Road Department.

Project #1 Tube: project is complete.

EWP's: the last project is being worked on.

Fleet: Andrew Braniff provided a fleet report. The Road Department discussed the most immediate needs would be a payloader and a vehicle to replace pick-up (#1) for Oakland. At this time, equipment is hard to get; the roads will work on replacement plans for equipment and for the time being, the board suggested using the old Emergency Management vehicle, (2007 Ford Expedition) in Oakland.

Gary Fugman and Cory Martin, both Burt County citizens, expressed their desire to have Burt County expand the *Burt County Zoning section 3.25 lighting ordinance* to cover more than just Industrial Zones. Ann Chtyka, Burt County Zoning Administrator will bring the request to the Burt County Zoning Board.

Burt County Extension: Mary Loftis, UNL extension assistant is going to be retiring from her UNL position effective January 31, 2022; her current position is half-time Medicare programming and half-time extension assistant. Burt County Extension educators Luan Oliveira and Jennifer Hansen explained to the Board that the Medicare services will no longer be provided via UNL programming therefore the new extension assistant will not be doing those half-time duties; however, they would like to ask that Burt County agree to hire the new extension assistant full-time in order to expand the youth programs. They further explained that the County will continue paying the University for the extension assistant wages as they always have during Loftis's tenure; however, the benefits package will now also have to be paid by the County because the current benefits payment agreement that was worked out for Loftis was grandfathered in during her tenure and will go away with her retirement. Motion was made by Richards, seconded by Pearson, to allow the hiring of a full-time Extension Assistant to be based out of the Burt County office; the County will be billed from and make payments to the University of Nebraska for





the salary and benefits for this position. Motions approved upon roll call vote: Ayes – Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays- none. Absent – Morrow.


As far as the Medicare programming that Loftis currently offers, the County will have to hire Mary Loftis as a County employee if they want to continue offering the Medicare services; Loftis was not present today to discuss.

Sheriff Eric Nick asked for the Board's consideration of hiring more Sheriff Deputies. Nick explained that the City of Lyons does not have any certified police officers at this time and the Village of Decatur only has part-time certified officers; with both departments not being staffed adequately, this requires his county Sheriff's department to handle all state statute violation calls and he does not have staffing to do so while still covering the rest of the County. Burt County Sheriff's department currently operates with six (6) full-time certified officers (1- Sheriff, 1- Chief Deputy, 4 -Deputy officers, and 1-2 part-time certified officers); Sheriff Nick is asking to raise this number to eight (8) certified officers by adding two (2) full-time Deputy officer positions. Nick also explained that he would then also need vehicles and equipment for two more positions. The County Board approved for Sheriff Nick to add one (1) more certified Deputy officer at this time.

Road Report and Hearing Set for Petition to vacate Road #60:

Ann Chytka, Burt County Highway Superintendent presented her Road Study of Public Road #60 (Co.Rd. 21 between Co.Rd. R and S). The following main points were made within the report: (a) this road is currently designated a township minimum maintenance road located in Logan Township; (b) there are currently 3 properties adjoining this road and there are no dwellings on those properties; (c) driving the road, she noted that the condition of the road was 'good' for being a minimum maintenance road. This particular stretch is the road is the 2nd mile in a 3 mile stretch of minimum maintenance road running north and south (d) between Nov. 17-25, 2021 road counters were placed on the north and south entrances on Co.Rd. 21; during that time there were 15 trips counted on the north side and 18 trips counted on the south side.and current petition; (e) based on facts listed in (a)-(d)- this road by the general 'traveling' public would serve a purpose; if this road was vacated then the traveling public would have 3 miles added to their trip. Chytka reported that based on her study, she is not in favor of vacating this road. The next step is to hold a public hearing.

A **Commercial Renovation Grant** application was approved; Plugge reported that the Burt County Economic Development board had reviewed the request and recommended their approval based upon the guidelines during the time of application: (Fund 0900) Reno Grant for Dale Jones to replace roof and front windows at 309 N. Oakland Ave., Oakland, \$15,000.00 (50% of the low bid) was approved upon motion by Connealy, seconded by Richards. By roll call vote: Ayes – 6. Nays – 0. Absent – District 1. Motion passed.

Emergency Manager position: A committee of three (Swanson, Richards, Pearson) interviewed three candidates, and today introduced the top candidate they'd agreed upon (Cheri Johansen). Cheri introduced herself to the board; she lives in Oakland with her family. Cheri's NEMA & FEMA certifications are not completed, but she expressed her willingness to see the Certification process through as quickly as she could. Cheri also agreed that she is willing to proceed with the needed LEOP manual update. Pearson made a motion to offer the Burt County Emergency Management job to Cheri Johansen, Richards seconded the motion. Roll call vote: Ayes - Swanson, Richards, Pearson, Webster, Connealy and Schold. Nays – none. Absent- District 1. Wages discussed: \$45,000.00 plus benefits starting and \$47,500.00 after Certification. 
